Participants will have the opportunity to live with a Yucatec family, visit world-class archeological sites, engage in service learning projects, and improve mastery of spoken Spanish.

Cost of the program: \$2565.00.

This amount covers room and board, three weekend excursions, weekly activities, one hour of daily conversation with native-Spanish tutors, and travel insurance.

This fee does not cover DSU credits, weekend meals when away from homestays, airfare US-Cancún, entry tax or personal expenses.
